Youth Director's Report Bryant Janetzke



My name is Bryant Janetzke and I am your new MDRC Youth Director. I am very excited to serve this year! I am 12 years old and in the Sixth Grade at Saranac Elementary. I have been showing rabbits within the MDRC since September of 2015. Since that time, I have learned so much from fellow youth and open members. My rabbitry consists primarily of gray and tortoise Dutch, with a couple black and blue Dutch, and a few Californians.

I am excited to attend my first NDS this year in Kalamazoo, MI and I remembered about a personal narrative that I wrote for school titled, *A Fair Story*. I thought that part of it would be a good reminder of what youth can be doing to prepare for the NDS Royalty competition.

My showmanship rabbit's name is Cami. She is the cutest rabbit I've ever seen. At least I think so. After that it was time for showmanship. When I went to go get my showmanship rabbit, I forgot to get my book. When I was ready, my mom said, "Don't forget to take your time." So, then I slowly walked up. It felt like 100 degrees beating on me.

With my rabbit tucked in my armpit the judge said, "Place your rabbit on the table." I set up the rabbit facing the judge. When the other two kids were done she said, "Handle your rabbit." I smoothly put the rabbit sideways and lifted it up by the ears and put the rabbit in my armpit, then stepped back. In 30 seconds she said, "Pose your rabbit."

I carefully set each leg and tail. When everybody was done she said, "Examine your rabbit." So, I set it sideways and began. First, I checked the base of the ears, then inside the ears, and eyes. I gently flipped the rabbit over on its back. Cami didn't budge. I gently checked its nose, then mouth, and dewlap. Then I lifted both front feet, then the pads of the feet. I did the same to the back. Next, I checked the gender of the rabbit and the tail. Lastly, I flipped the rabbit over, checking the tail again then the ears and the type. When everyone was done, the judge asked me some questions.

"Which breed has guard hairs?"

I didn't know so I said, "Californians."

"How many toes does a rabbit have in the front?"

"5." I knew that one. Then I was sent back.

After about 20 minutes, which felt like millions of years, I went to breed class. First, I judged some Lops. I never had judged them, so it was different. I looked at all 4 of their types. I placed them how I thought and moved on. Next was Mini Rex. They are really soft. Then I did the same as the Lop. Then I turned the paper in.

About a hour later it was time for awards. First was senior showmanship, then intermediate, and junior. Finally, what I wanted all day was about to happen.

"For first place, Bryant Janetzke.!"

I could hardly believe this. It was like a dream. I also got first for breed class and judging.

It was the best day of my life. When was the time of your life?

Whether you answer questions right or wrong or forget a step, you should keep going, keep your head up, and smile. Be confident in your answers and study hard. Put all of your effort into it. Even if you don't know, make an educated guess. This will be my first time at NDS. I am hoping it will be better than I am imagining.

NDS Fun Classes Kristy Grinold

I am excited to be in charge of the Friday night fun classes this year! While Saturday's big show is obviously the highlight, Friday is all about mingling with other breeders and having a good time!

This year I have come up with three classes, and while one is pretty standard, the other two are unique. It is important to me to offer classes that encourage good breeding practices.

This year's fun classes are as follows:

Best Type

Simply put, we want to see your best-typed rabbit! Did your best show rabbit lose a nail or break a tail? Or maybe that stop is a little *too* short, or that elbow a little tied... it's no secret that a lot of breeders successfully use un-showable rabbits in their breeding programs, so disqualifications will be allowed, as long as the rabbit is healthy and of breeding quality. **Rabbits will only be judged on type.** One entry per exhibitor, please.

Rockstar Rookie

We want to showcase our newest breeders! If you've been raising and showing Dutch **for less than 2 years**, this fun class is for you! Enter your best rabbit and see how it stacks up against other rookie breeders. **Exhibitors may only enter rabbits they bred.** Judging will be based off the ARBA Dutch standard. **One entry per exhibitor**, please.

An Oldie, but a Goodie

Do you have a buck that just won't quit? A doe that keeps coming back beautiful after every litter? Well, we want to see them! **This class is only for rabbits over 3 years of age.** Judging will be based off the ARBA Dutch standard. **Birthdates of entries must be provided at time of entry.**

It would be impossible for the same rabbit to be in the "Rockstar Rookie" and the "An Oldie, but a Goodie" classes, so they can be run concurrently. Also, **each fun class is run as a single class, meaning open & youth, bucks & does, juniors & seniors, and all colors, will be shown together.**

Fun classes are not required to be judged by ARBA licensed judges, so it gives us the opportunity to choose some new judges. These judges are volunteers and are well-known breeders who have raised nationally winning Dutch. I am very excited to announce judges **Dan Schwandt** of Wisconsin, **Briony Smith** of Kansas (who is a licensed ARBA judge, a nice bonus!), and **Lonnie Harper** of Ohio.

Fun class entries are going to be offered at **\$5** per class. Rabbits are entered Friday prior to the start of classes. **A 50% cash payback will be offered** to the winner of the class in the hopes of encouraging a higher number of entries. I am planning on donating some sort of fun award to each class winner as well. There will only be **one winner chosen per class** in order to "up the ante" as well as make the job easier on the judge if the classes are very large (which we hope they will be!)

NDS Show Secretary Report Jane Burt

Are you getting excited about our upcoming NDS? What a wonderful opportunity for us to show our ADRC friends some real Michigan hospitality.

You might be wondering what would motivate me to consider being secretary for our NDS. How about love of a breed, and friendships. Janet and I go way back to high school and playing saxophone in the band. We have worked together on numerous large events including the 2007 ARBA Convention, where I was the General Chairperson and Janet my assistant. Sort of reversing the roles this time.

My first breed was Dutch from the mid 1980's until the mid-1990's. I was one of the founding officers of the MDRC and served as secretary for the first Michigan NDS in 1992 in Saline. That was before computer programs, so I spent my evenings for nearly two weeks writing out remark cards for around 900 entries. Then spent the next week finalizing the paperwork and mailing exhibitor reports.

Things will be much different this year with the computer program, however I will still have to get all the rabbits entered into the program, but I have two weeks to get that accomplished. I will be using two laptops, one for open and another for youth. I also plan to bring two laser printers, one for each computer. So that I am not cross-eyed from doing data entry all day Saturday, I have a crew ready to assist me in entering the placements as the judging is completed for each class. It is my goal to have all paperwork completed and the check-out packets stuffed with at least the remark cards and ribbons prior to the banquet. To make this happen, I will need some help during the day on Saturday. If you can spare a few minutes, that would be fantastic.

We will be using pre-printed remark cards that are specific to our breed. I have secured advertising on them (like was done in 2013) which will cover the cost of that item as well as the coop cards. We will again be using multi colored coop cards for ease in identifying each class.

I will be bringing my photo studio equipment to set up a photo booth. Thanks to Janet, we have a nice 2018 NDS banner to have on the backdrop to enhance the photos. Our goal is to get nice photos of the class winners from the show. The set up will be available for any exhibitor to take a picture of their rabbit. We will also have the backdrop and lights set up at the banquet (with the banner) for pictures of the show and sweepstakes winners.

Looking forward to our NDS and being back on the Dutch show tables very soon.

Secretary Report: Jenny shared the membership numbers for the fall. September membership 5 Youth, 1 Open; October Membership 1 Youth, 1 Open; November Membership 1 Youth

It was also mentioned that the booth for the 4H show needs to be discussed, as a flyer came in the mail. This was already marked as an agenda item. Char made a motion to accept the secretary report, Noah H. second the motion . Motion Passed.

NDS: 9:00 Wednesday through Thursday AM is when much of the set up will be needing to take place (April 25-26). Friday is royalty. Discussion took place about previous entry fees. Last time it was \$6/head and we had 382 head, with \$3/head for sale cages. There were 122 exhibitors. Discussing of pricing and expenses- cost for awards/donations. Nancy made a motion to charge \$7.50/head with a sliding scale (like last time it was hosted). Andrea second the motion. Motion Passed.

Exhibitor Packet: Ideas: Kazoo (NDS 2018) plastic, .10 each for open and youth. Key chains with logo \$2 each, so \$300 total. Nancy made a motion to use the key chains as the exhibitor gift in the packet, with also the kazoo (as a donated item). Katie second the motion. Motion Passed.

Awards: A committee will be formed- set up by Nancy and Andrea. Awards need to be ordered for both the show and Royalty.

Budget: Todd need to contact people /get contacts...need a budget.

Banners for donations / Sponsors will be needed.

Email Micki if there are things that your committee needs to communicate to the public and she can post it on Facebook.

Hotels are set for NDS.

Caterer is set for NDS.

Friday night exhibitor meal: ice cream, hot dogs, chips. Andrea made a motion for there to be a meal provided on Friday night at NDS. Kristy second the motion. Motion passed.

NDS Publicity- TSpring- communicate logo through the company and there are many options. Everything funnels through Tspring, they ship the product and cut the check. Exhibitors and club member's publicity. Nancy made a motion to carry through with this option. Micki second. Motion passed.

NDS Committees: Nancy discussed what committees need to be formed. DAY OF SHOW, Input information into the computer- Andrea and Emma can do this.

Show Secretary:

Nancy made a motion that the show or co-show secretary committee needs to solicit their own help. Katie second the motion. Motion passed

Awards Committee /Ribbons

Logo Contest: Great Lakes, Great Dutch slogan/logo. Shannon made a motion to accept this logo and slogan. Bryant second the motion. Motion Passed. (Suggestion made to add dates to some?)

2018 State 4H Show booth- Nancy made a motion to pass on this option. Char second the motion. Motion passed.

MSU Convention /Spring Show Raffle and Booth- Nancy made a motion to make a committee, Micki Second the motion. Motion Passed. Andrea will lead the committee and will be the “go to” person.

Newsletter Editor: Formatting. Issued Quarterly. 2-3 hours of time per quarter. Nancy volunteered to Co-Edit with Char.

Sweepstakes 2018- Kristy volunteered to take over the role of tallying the points for Sweepstakes in 2018 if someone can help with pictures/show reports. Others volunteered to do this at the shows.

Sweepstakes 2017 awards need to be decided in the next 3 weeks. Currently short 1/3 of the money. Donations being accepted. Micki/Katie will be ordering awards.

2018 Specialty show? No, because NDS counts towards our yearly specialty show. Nancy made a motion to accept the 2018 NDS Specialty show as our yearly specialty requirement, Micki second the motion. Motion Passed.

MICHIGAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I NAME

SECTION 1.

This association shall be known under the name and style of the Michigan Dutch Rabbit Club.

SECTION 2.

The above-named Association shall be chartered with the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. and shall not proceed in any manner or have any rule that is in conflict with said Association.

SECTION 3.

This Association shall host at least one (1) annual all-Dutch show.

SECTION 4.

Upon dissolution any remaining funds shall be split with one half going to the ARBA Youth Scholarship Fund and one half going to the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1.

Any person of good character and reputation may make application for membership in the association.

SECTION 2.

Application for membership shall be in written form through any current member with the organization. The signed application with membership fee for one (1) year from date of acknowledgement and receipt of membership dues as fixed in the By-Laws.

SECTION 3.

Any member having paid 30 years of adult membership regardless of age, or that has 20 years of paid membership upon reaching the age of 65 will receive a life membership.

SECTION 4. The Executive Committee reserves the right to approve or reject, for any cause, any application for membership or renewal in this association.

SECTION 5.

All members, including out of state members, will be considered voting members in this association. Those not residing in the State of Michigan will not be allowed to hold office.

ARTICLE III OFFICERS

SECTION 1.

The Elective Officers of the association shall consist of:

- a. President
- b. Vice-President
- c. Secretary
- d. Treasurer
- e. Directors (3) Open (1) Youth
- f. The Secretary and Treasurer can be two elected positions or one individual combined elected position.

SECTION 2.

All elected officers shall meet the following criteria:

- a. Be a resident of the State of Michigan
- b. Be a current member of the American Rabbit Breeders Association
- c. Be a current member of the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

SECTION 3

Term of Office:

- a. The Office of President, Secretary and one (1) Director shall be for a term of two (2) years, to be elected on the odd numbered years.
- b. The Office of Treasurer, Vice President and two (2) Directors shall be for a term of two (2)

SECTION 4.

The term of office for these officers shall be assumed on January 1st of the fiscal year and continue until December 31st of the second year following, or until one tenders their resignation in written form to the Executive Committee.

SECTION 5.

Vacancies of office during a regular term shall be appointed by the President, with the approval of the Executive Committee present, with no proxy votes.

SECTION 6.

The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary and/or Treasurer and three (3) Open Directors.

ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

SECTION 1.

The President shall have the following duties:

- a. Preside at all meetings of the above-named association.
- b. Act as chairperson of the Executive Committee.
- c. Appoint all committees as necessary.
- d. Plan all meetings of the Association and the Executive Committee.
- e. Fill all vacancies and assume such duties as pertain to the office of President.
- f. Follow Roberts Rules of Order in conduction all business meetings.

SECTION 2.

The Vice-Presidents duties shall consist of:

- a. The same as the Presidents in his/her absence or disability.
- b. He/she shall assist the President with duties as requested.

. SECTION 3.

The Secretary shall have the following duties:

- a. Perform all correspondence for the above-named Association.
 - b. To send out all notices for meetings of the Association and the Executive Committee.
 - c. To keep minutes from all Association and Executive Committee meetings and to keep all pertinent records on file for one (1) year including all letters received and a copy of all letters sent out.
 - d. Perform all duties as directed by the President and Executive Committee.
 - e. Assume no obligation and take no actions of major importance without specific authority from President or Executive Committee.
 - f. Forward all collected money for memberships to the Treasurer.
 - g. Assist members and breeders when possible.
-

SECTION 4

The Treasurer shall have the following duties:

- a. Perform all duties as directed by the President and Executive Committee.
- b. Assume no obligation and take no actions of major importance without specific authority from President or Executive Committee.
- c. Assist members and breeders when possible.
- d. Secretary/Treasurer shall collect all monies due and make payable from funds of the club, all claims as properly authorized and approved.
- e. Have all books audited within thirty (30) days after December 31st by an auditing committee appointed by the President.

SECTION 5

If the Secretary and Treasurer is elected as a combined position, the duties will be combined.

SECTION 6.

The Executive Committee consisting of the Officers and the Board of Directors shall have the following responsibilities:

- a. Have charge of all business transactions of the association.
- b. Authorize all special expenditures of money from the treasury.
- c. Act upon special expenditures of money from the treasury in conflict with the instrument of the Constitution and By-Laws.
- d. Have exclusive power to make contracts in the name of the Association.
- e. Supervise all business of the Association.
- f. Supervise all duties of the Officers.
- g. Make rules as deemed necessary during the year for the club and the meetings.
- h. Select judges and prizes to be awarded at the ALL-DUTCH SHOW.
- i. Assist any breeder or member when possible.

ARTICLE V DISCIPLINE

Section 1.

The Board of Directors may, by a 2/3 majority, suspend or expel any member, providing charges have been made by another member. If the charges are upheld, the Secretary will inform the member against whom the charges were made. The member will be given thirty (30) days to reply to the charges before action is taken by the Board. If reply is made, it shall be considered by the Board along with the charges

Section 2.

Any person expelled or rejected shall not be eligible for reinstatement for one (1) year, and only upon approval of the Board.

Section 3. An officer whose membership has expired shall be notified by mail. If the renewal has not been made within thirty (30) days from the date of expiration, the office shall be declared vacant and the President shall fill by appointment the unexpired term of office.

Section 4.

An officer who shows lack of interest in his/her official duties, or fails to answer correspondence of Club matters, shall be asked by the President to resign. If there is failure to do so, the Board by a 2/3 majority shall declare the office vacant and the President shall appoint an officer to fill the remaining term of office.

Section 5.

An officer who gives up the breeding of Dutch rabbits during his/her term of office shall resign his/her office and the President shall appoint a replacement to fill the remaining term of office.
